I'm excited about this venture, as itprovides an opportunity to share the

warmth, compassion and love of God withthose who are involved in recovery. Sooften, the experience people have with church or religion is rigid, narrow and focusedon rules and regulations. Recently I'vefelt like God is calling us to "expand our circle" and this is a perfectopportunity to do just that. It is ourhope that the group will be open to breaking bread/Eucharist as so much healingoccurs around the table, but we'll start out slowly and see where it goes fromthere. Please keep this initiative inyour thoughts and prayers. There are alot of hurting people in our world.

As some of you know, this past yearl've been a part of a group of women who were invited to help the ECC look atits implicit sexism and clericalism. Given the long history of sexism and clericalism in the church it's notsurprising that some of this seeps in without any intent or malice. As a result of this work, we were invited towrite a document on the important and significant roles that a woman bishopwould serve within the ECC. While thereare many female priests and deacons in the ECC, we do not yet have a femalebishop. We have finished our work onthis paper and it is now being disseminated to the ECC communities, etc. You'll find this document attached. I'd love to hear your thoughts!

We have a new group starting at MaryMagdalene. The Gaia (Earth) Team's goalis to increase awareness of Mary Magdalene church's environmental footprint andto find ways in which we can minimize our environmental impact. A beginning initiative is to move away fromthe use of Styrofoam, which can take up to 500 years and longer to biodegrade.
