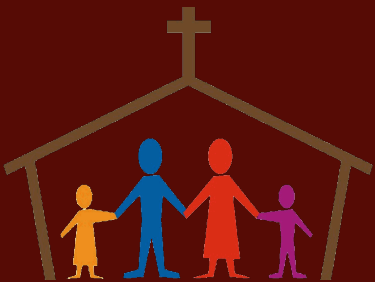

Happy Friendship day

Greetings friend!

Phil and I just returned from our annual camping trip to Rollins Pond State Park in the Adirondacks. Rollins Pond is a place that centers me every single year. I experience such tranquility sitting by the still water, breathing in the mountain air, watching the clouds nestle in among the high peaks, witnessing God's majesty in the sunsets, laughing around the campfire with family and enjoying homemade ice cream from Donnelly's!

It also allows me some time to read. This year, at the recommendation of Marj Chapin-Parker, I'm reading "The Dark Night of the Soul" by Gerald G. May. I've read several of Gerald May's books before including "Addiction & Grace," "Will & Spirit," and "Simply Sane." (I highly recommend his books - Addiction & Grace is one I've read several times!)

In "The Dark Night of the Soul," May focuses on the work of Saints John of the Cross and Teresa of Avila (Teresa of Avila's book "Interior Castle" was one of my favorites during my seminary education). May points out that both Sts. John & Teresa believed that finding God and growing toward union with God is not something that could be achieved because "union with God already exists (!) Everyone always has been and always will be in union with God... We are born in union with God and we 'live and move and have our being' in God (Acts 17:28) throughout our lives." They say that "The problem for most of us is that we don't *realize* how united we are with God." May points out that a simple prayer at the opening of a meeting that begins "God be with us" makes it sound as if God might be in attendance at another meeting! He points out that our life journey is not really about seeking God, but it's more a journey of raising our consciousness and realizing that deep intimacy and union with God already exist! He points out that there is a seed of desire in each of us, a longing or yearning for intimacy with God that is intended to make us more aware of our fundamental union with God. In other words - it's a myth to believe that we are ever really apart from God!! "All human beings are created in and from the love of God, with an inborn love for God that continually arises from God and constantly seeks God. This love is meant to flow for all people and all creation. THIS IS OUR TRUE HUMAN NATURE. It is who we are." p. 51

(emphasis added.) I highly recommend you pick up *The Dark Night of the Soul* or *Addiction & Grace*. All of his books are very accessible and easy to follow.

The concepts May presents brought to mind "A Course in Miracles." So much of what I just described within Gerald May's book are basic tenets of the Course. This Fall we will be offering an opportunity to study "A Course in Miracles" together. Dijana Winter has been leading study groups on "A Course in Miracles" since 1992. Watch for information about the course in the bulletins, and Dijana will present some information on it at a coffee hour tentatively scheduled for October 22.

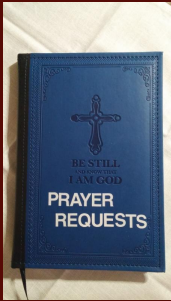
